TRANSCULTURAL

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Transcultural Collaboration is a unique international semester programme in the arts and design, and a cooperation between Shared Campus partner institutions in Asia and Europe.

30 BA and MA students from all arts and design disciplines have the chance to explore Zurich, Taipei, and Singapore, collaborating on experiments with open outcomes.





ON TRANSCULTURAL COLLABORATION

Today, artists, performers, musicians, curators and designers need a multi-perspective mindset, as well as a genuine commitment and willingness to communicate, exchange, and debate ideas and opinions within a global framework, critically reflecting on manifold interconnected issues and questions. Given the complex and pressing nature of the problems facing all of us, we are convinced that close cooperation is imperative for tackling these issues.

BETWEEN ZURICH, TAIPEI AND SINGAPORE

Zurich and Taipei are the two main locations of the programme. They serve as the base and common playground for explorations and experiments. Their different cultural and historical developments and living environments provide interesting insights and opportunities for reflection on a variety of topics such as value systems, politics, traditions and cultural hybridization, or power structures. A field trip to Singapore will offer a third perspective.

ON TRANSCULTURALITY

For contemporary creative practitioners, a transcultural mindset and attitude is necessary in order to deal with different cultures on many levels. They act as facilitators between different political, social, economic, and cultural contexts. Not only professional expertise is required, but also the ability to understand and negotiate the diversity of global cultures and societies. Artists and designers can take the role of agents who constantly observe, reflect, distinguish, and position themselves in dynamic environments, withstanding frictions, and demanding to make things visible, to mediate, to produce, and to act precisely.

ON COLLABORATION

When making use of different working methods or approaches, one might come up with ideas and conceptions that are beyond regular imagination and capabilities. Collaboration as a principal working method exposes participants to different mindsets, traditions, and aesthetic understandings. Working in cross-cultural and cross-disciplinary teams allows for direct exchange and debate on topics of common interest, while at the same time critically reflecting on each other's perception, values, and way of working. It is a way of expanding the artistic toolkit, helping participants to better understand their own discipline.

ON THE PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The programme is divided in three parts: a 4-week stay in Zurich, a 9-week stay in Taipei and a 2-week field trip to Singapore. The core programme is dedicated to practice-based collaboration and teamwork between the participants in changing constellations. An annual semester topic and a related lecture series serve to focus debates and provide a framework for practical experimentation. The programme is complemented with additional inputs by guests, excursions, and workshops. Participants receive close support from selected faculty from all partner institutions, as well as from independent artists and experts from various arts and design disciplines. The semester includes a symposium in Singapore and a public presentation in Taipei.

COVID RELATED INFORMATION

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, restrictions for entry into Taiwan might still be in place in autumn. In that case, the following two alternatives will be taken into consideration:

- 1) Zurich + Singapore + field trip to Malaysia
- 2) Athens + Istanbul

SEMESTER DATES

23 August — 2 December 2022: 15 weeks

PARTICIPANTS

The programme offers places to 30 students from the participating partner institutions from a wide range of arts and design disciplines, including performing arts, music, fine arts, media arts, curating, design, and art education. Emphasis is placed on a good mixture of disciplines.

ADMISSION CRITERIA AND REQUIREMENTS

- A genuine interest in and willingness to identify and analyse transcultural questions
- An ability and interest to work in teams whose members come from different cultural and disciplinary backgrounds
- A willingness to expose oneself and one's work, to engage in critical reflection, to experiment and take artistic risks, and to participate full-time in the semester programme
- Proficient in English

CREDITS

Students remain enrolled in their home programmes. At HKBU it is possible to get up to 15 credits for this semester programme.

STUDENT COSTS

- Tuition fees: Regular home institution semester fees
- Travel & Accommodation: Partial sponsorship available for the students

TEACHING FACULTY

Lecturers and artists from Asia and Europe. Faculty come from various arts and design disciplines, and a range of academic backgrounds.
